

All the moon names in the solar system

The solar system encompasses planets, moons, asteroids, comets, and dwarf planets, that orbit around the Sun at its center. The solar system was created about 4.6 billion years ago in a collapsing cloud of gas and dust that eventually flattened into a rotating disk. The two main regions of the solar system are the inner and outer solar systems.

The giant planets Jupiter and Saturn lead our solar system's moon counts. In some ways, the swarms of moons around these worlds resemble mini versions of our solar system. Pluto, smaller than our own moon, has five moons in its orbit, including the Charon, a moon so large it makes Pluto wobble. Even tiny asteroids can have moons.

The order and arrangement of the planets and other bodies in our solar system is due to the way the solar system formed. Nearest to the Sun, only rocky material could withstand the heat when the solar system was young. For this reason, the first four planets - Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars - are terrestrial planets.

Mercury nor Venus has any moons at all, Earth has one, and Mars has its two small moons. In the outer solar system, the gas giants (Jupiter, Saturn) and the ice giants (Uranus and Neptune) have numerous moons. As these huge planets grew in the early solar system, they were able to capture objects with their large gravitational fields.
