A confederate system sits at the other extreme in terms of centralization. A confederacy is a loose relationship among a number of smaller political units. The vast majority of political power rests with the local governments; the central federal government has very little power.

The primary role of citizens in government at the federal level is that citizens vote for representatives. In the confederation system, citizens will have the most power- because this system is mostly comprised of its local governments. In the unitary system, citizens are (mostly) not involved and leave everything up to their central government.

Congress remained throughout the war relatively weak and unassertive. Reluctant lawmakers were even persuaded in March 1865 to authorize the enlistment of slave soldiers. Indeed throughout the war, the Confederate government took unprecedented steps, most notably with conscription and impressment, in mobilizing men and materiel.

These are systems in which the head of state is a constitutional monarch; the existence of their office and their

Confederal System . Weak or loose organization of states agrees to follow a powerful central government. Nations can choose to follow or not follow the lead of the weak central government. Unitary state, a system of political organization in which most or all of the governing power resides in a centralized government. In a unitary state, the central government commonly delegates authority to subnational units and channels policy decisions down to ...
