Do Xbox controllers use batteries?

Xbox controllers are known for their use of batteries, while PlayStation controllers have an internal rechargeable battery. The Xbox Series X controller still uses AA batteries, while the PlayStation 5's DualSense controller has an internal rechargeable battery.

Can I use a rechargeable battery with the Xbox wireless controller?

Note The new Xbox Wireless Controller uses the Xbox Rechargeable Battery +USB-C Cable. You can also use the Xbox One Play & Charge Kit; however, you'll need to use a USB-C cable and not the cable provided in the kit. If you're not using the Play & Charge kit battery pack, use only AA batteries that have an "LR6" designation (alkaline batteries).

Does the Xbox series X/s controller use AA batteries?

Like the Xbox 360 and Xbox One controllers, the Xbox Series X/S controller uses disposable AA batteries by default rather than internal, rechargeable battery packs, such as those found in the PS3, PS4 and PS5 controllers.

Does Xbox One use a battery?

Unlike the PlayStation 4's DualShock 4 and the Switch Pro Controller, the Xbox One doesn't use an internal battery. By default, it requires standard AA batteries.

How do I upgrade my Xbox controller to a rechargeable battery?

The easiest way to upgrade your controller to be rechargeable is to purchase Microsoft's official Play and Charge Kit (\$24.99). The kit includes a Lithium-ion rechargeable battery pack and charging cable with a USB-C connector (for Xbox Series X|S). These batteries take around four hours to charge completely and contain around 1400 mAh.

Does Xbox One have a rechargeable battery?

Microsoft sells a rechargeable battery pack made especially for the Xbox One, the Xbox One Play and Charge Kit, which replaces your AA batteries with a lithium-ion battery pack that you charge using a Micro USB cable. Connecting the cable to your console also allows you to connect the controller without syncing it wirelessly.
