The core element of a flywheel consists of a rotating mass, typically axisymmetric, which stores rotary kinetic energy E according to (Equation 1)  $E = 1 \ 2 \ I$  o 2 [J], where E is the stored kinetic energy, I is the flywheel moment of inertia [kgm 2], and o is the angular speed [rad/s]. A flywheel is a mechanical storage system that converts electricity to kinetic energy during charging and the kinetic energy back to electricity during discharge. Steel rotor FESSs are the most widely used FESSs, but recent developments in composite materials have encouraged manufacturers to produce composite rotor FESSs.
