

How long can breast milk be stored?

How long you can safely keep expressed breast milk depends on the storage method. Consider these general guidelines: Room temperature. Freshly expressed breast milk can be kept at room temperature for up to six hours. However, it's optimal to use or properly store the breast milk within four hours, especially if the room is warm. Insulated cooler.

How long can breast milk stay in the fridge?

Freshly pumped breast milk can be stored in the back of the refrigerator (39° F or 4° C) for up to four days-- just don't forget it's back there. Thawed, previously frozen breast milk can stay in the refrigerator for 24 hours before you have to throw it out. (No mom wants that!) So, only take out what you think your little one will need for a day.

Can breast milk be stored in a freezer?

You can store breast milk in a refrigerator with a freezer that has a separate door (0°F or -18°C) for up to 12 months, although using it within six months is preferable. The earlier you use up your breast milk, the better, because longer storage can diminish the amount of vitamin C in it. The temperature of your freezer should be around 0° F.

Can breast milk be stored at room temperature?

Breast milk can be kept at room temperature,in a refrigerator or in a freezer -- and how long you can store your milk safely depends on its location and the containers you use. In most cases,you'll want to store 2 to 4 ounces of breast milk at a time. On average,this is the amount of milk that your baby consumes in a single feeding.

How long can milk be stored?

Milk can be stored: Up to four daysin a standard refrigerator. Up to three to four months inside a standard refrigerator freezer. Up to six to 12 months in a separate deep freezer. In an insulated cooler bag with frozen ice packs for up to 24 hours while traveling.

How long is breast milk good for?

If storing it in a fridge, the freshly pumped breast milk is good for up to 48 hours. Dedicated refrigerators and freezers are provided for breast milk storage in the hospital. Thawed, previously frozen breast milk must be used within 24 hours (if thawed in the refrigerator) or two hours (if warmed) or it must be discarded.

So, a good rule of thumb is to avoid feeding leftovers by storing breast milk in smaller amounts. If refrigeration is available, store milk there. No more than 72 hours. Store at the back, where it is coldest. 2 weeks in freezer compartment inside refrigerator (-15°C) 3 months in freezer section of refrigerator with separate door (-18°C) 6 to 12 months in deep freeze (-20°C*) Previously frozen - thawed in refrigerator but not yet warmed

After this window, the milk may begin to lose nutrients and develop harmful bacteria, ...
