

# How to paint the planets of the solar system

Here's how to create planet art ... Fold the planet template in half and cut out the circle. Discard the centre and use the outside as a mask. Place the mask over the top of your black sheet of card stock. This can be done by just holding the mask in place, being careful not to let it move or slip.

But it's hard to picture the sun with all the planets unless you have a 3D model. Below you will find an easy way to make a DIY 3D solar system model for preschoolers and elementary school kids. To make a planet model with papier mache, blow up a balloon slightly until you have a round shape, tie off the end, and place the balloon in a bowl. Create your adhesive in a separate bowl, then tear your paper into strips, dip them in the adhesive, and cover the balloon's surface with them. Try to smooth out bubbles and bumps unless you want the planet to have a ...

Pluto was the 9th planet in the Solar System until 2006 when it was considered a dwarf planet instead. Its size is smaller than the Earth's Moon, with a lovely heart glacier that's apparently the size of Texas and Oklahoma, according ...

Paint each styrofoam ball in the colors that correspond to the different planets in our solar system. For example, paint Mercury a dark gray, Venus a light yellowish-orange, Earth a light blue with green accents, Mars a reddish-orange, and so on. ... Research the moons of the different planets in our solar system and select the appropriate ...

For now, let's just focus on the basics of painting planets. **STEP 1: PAINT A BLACK CIRCLE.** The first thing to do when painting a planet is to paint a black circle where you want your planet to be. What brush you want to use for this depends on what you're comfortable with. As you can see I'm using a smaller brush here since I'm going ...

**STEP 3A. PAINT THE PLANETS** Step 4: Prep the Solar System Mobile. Take the now painted and dry galaxy plate and cut a spiral as pictured below (about 2" wide as you go around and a stub left in the middle). This is the base of your ...
