Former U.S. President Jimmy Carter leased 10 acres of land near his hometown in Plains, Georgia, to be used as a 3,852-panel solar farm. ... The 39th president's 32 White House solar panels are currently on display at The Smithsonian Institute, the Carter Library, and the Solar Science and Technology Museum in Dezhou, China.

But we must work together to turn our vision and our dream into a solar reality. ... I dedicate, this afternoon, this solar heater, harnessing the rays of the Sun to the benefit of those who serve our country at the White House." President Jimmy Carter dedicating the solar-thermal panels on the roof of the White House, 20 June 1979.

Press conferences at the White House tend to occur in predictable locations: The Briefing Room, the Rose Garden, the South Lawn. In 1979, President Jimmy Carter chose a loftier venue: the roof. He didn't do it for the view over Washington, D.C.; he wanted to show off a brand-new array of 32 solar panels.

During his term in office, President Jimmy Carter fought for clean energy using renewable sources. As a symbol of his faith in "the power of the sun," Carter had 32 solar panels installed on the White House West Wing roof in the summer of 1979. These panels were used to heat water in the household for seven years until President Ronald ...

The original solar panels that were installed atop the White House during Jimmy Carter's presidency were kept in government storage until 1991, when Unity College in Maine refurbished and installed 16 of the 32 panels atop its cafeteria. The solar panels provided Unity College's cafeteria with hot water until 2005, having taken advantage of the total lifespan of the ...

White house solar panels have been through a few bumps. President Jimmy Carter installed solar panels on the White House roof in 1979. The Reagan administration removed the original solar panels in 1986. The Unity College in Maine used some of the panels to heat their cafeteria for a few years before donating them to the

On June 30, 1979, 32 solar panels were installed on the roof of the White House above the Oval Office to heat water in the staff kitchen, which was often used by President Carter. ... In 1979, President Jimmy Carter, after months of wrangling politically to bring about green energy awareness, installed thirty-two solar panels on the roof of the White House. At the time, the Carter Administration was in the midst of the Arab oil embargo, which had caused a shortage of fossil fuels in the United States.

Since Jimmy Carter's decision to install solar panels on the White House in 1979, the property's use of solar energy has ebbed and flowed with each president residing there. In this article, we'll explore how each president since Carter has shaped the ways in which both the White House and the nation use photovoltaics.

Jimmy Carter's recognition of the need to foster renewable energy systems has gained wider currency in the 21st century. Indeed, two subsequent residents of 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue ordered the installation of modest solar energy systems: in 2002, President George W.
