What is the largest planet in the Solar System?

Earth is the largest terrestrial or inner planet. Our solar system comprises eight planets, which fall into two categories: the smaller, rocky inner planets (Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars) and the larger, gas giants (Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune). Another name for the gas giants is the Jovian planets, for their similarity to Jupiter.

What are the smallest and largest planets in order?

The size of the planets in order from smallest to largest is Mercury, Mars, Venus, Earth, Neptune, Uranus, Saturn, and Jupiter. The size of planets in our solar system varies dramatically. Let's explore the sizes of the planets, including their radius and diameter in both kilometers and miles, and their relative sizes compared to Earth.

Are Jupiter and Saturn the largest planets in the Solar System?

The outer solar system contained vast amounts of hydrogen and helium, allowing planets like Jupiter and Saturn to become the largest planets in the solar system. Interestingly, Jupiter and Saturn are probably the two most similar planets in the solar system. Both are composed chiefly of hydrogen and helium and are covered in large bands of gas.

Which planets are gas giants?

As gas giants, these planets don't have a solid surface like terrestrial planets and consist mainly of gases (hydrogen and helium). Uranus would round out the top three as the third largest planet in the solar system, but it doesn't come close to even the size of the second largest planet, Saturn. In fact, Jupiter is 2.8x larger than Uranus.

What are the smallest planets in our Solar System?

It has a diameter of approximately 72,367 miles (116,464 kilometers), making it the second-largest planet in the solar system (after Jupiter) and about 9 times wider than Earth.

There are four such planets in the Solar System: Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus ...

This illustration shows the approximate sizes of the planets relative to each other. Outward from the Sun, the planets are Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune, followed by the dwarf planet Pluto. Jupiter's diameter is about 11 times that of the Earth's and the Sun's diameter is about 10 times Jupiter's.

Mercury is the closest (first) planet to the Sun and the smallest member of our Solar System s diameter is 4,878 kilometers, and its mass is only 5.5% of the mass of the Earth.

As the term is applied to bodies in Earth's solar system, the International Astronomical Union (IAU) lists eight planets orbiting the Sun. Pluto also was listed as a planet until 2006. The stars with the most confirmed planets are the Sun (the Solar System's star) and Kepler-90, with 8 confirmed planets each, followed by TRAPPIST-1 with 7 planets. The 1007 multiplanetary systems are listed below according to the star's distance from Earth. Proxima Centauri, the closest star to the Solar System, has three planets (b, c and d).
