

# The role of flywheel energy storage vehicle

Are flywheel energy storage systems suitable for commercial applications?

Among the different mechanical energy storage systems, the flywheel energy storage system (FESS) is considered suitable for commercial applications. An FESS, shown in Figure 1, is a spinning mass, composite or steel, secured within a vessel with very low ambient pressure.

This is due to the increasing manufacturing capabilities and the growing variety of materials available for use in FESS construction. While many papers compare different ESS technologies, only a few research studies design and control flywheel-based hybrid energy storage systems. Recently, Zhang et al. present a hybrid energy storage system based on compressed air energy storage and FESS.

What machines are used in flywheel energy storage systems?

Three common machines used in flywheel energy storage systems are the induction machine (IM), the variable reluctance machine (VRM), and the permanent magnet machine (PM). For high-power applications, an IM is utilised as it is very rugged, has high torque, and is not expensive.

Electric energy input accelerates the mass to speed via an integrated motor-generator. The energy is discharged by drawing down the kinetic energy using the same motor-generator. Specially, an extreme continuous discharge phase during the driving condition of vehicle is selected. Then, the energy storage capacity of flywheel battery is confirmed during such discharge process. For the electric vehicle with composite energy storage system, the power required by vehicle is provided by flywheel battery and lithium battery.
