What happened to Lorde's 'solar power'?

After another four-year hiatus, Lorde returned in June with a new single, "Solar Power." The song received a mixed reaction upon its release, with many saying that it hewed too closely to two other pop songs: George Michael's "Freedom! '90" and Primal Scream's "Loaded."

What is Lorde's last song on solar power?

Solar Power 's final track, "Oceanic Feeling", is Lorde's longest song to date, and one of the two songs on the album with O'Connor's exclusive writing credits (alongside the album's opener, "The Path"). Its title comes from Romain Rolland 's concept of a feeling of oneness with the world.

When did Lorde release solar power?

Solar Power is the third studio album by New Zealand singer-songwriter Lorde. It was released on 20 August 2021, by Universal.
